Two strangers enter a room. Each holds a sheet of paper on which each has written a brief first-person life story. Two facilitators—who have previously met these strangers only virtually–greet them, invite them to sit down, to tell their reasons for coming.



KUNM Remembers Matthew Finch

Back in 2004, KUNM needed to hire a new Music Director...Our applicant pool was a bit thin. Then, we saw Matthew's application and began to smile. His cover letter, on WBAI letterhead, read just like he knew us from the inside out. In search committee interviews, Matthew demonstrated his embrace of music from around the world and across the ages. How many radio workers could list <u>Davey D</u> as a professional reference in 2004? I was honored to The strangers exchange papers. Each reads the other's words aloud. For a few minutes, each speaks in the other's voice. Each lives the other's life. Another "One Small Step" conversation has begun.

Based on contact theory—which suggests that prejudice and conflict between groups can be reduced if their members interact with each other—these conversations create a structure through which personal communication can remind divided communities of individual common humanity. Over 2,528 people across 40 states have participated.

"He was the baby of the family," [his sister] said. "You know, he was the wild child, the real envelope pusher... Whenever he was interested in something, he always did a really deep dive. He would do that with art, he would do that with music, he would do that with playwriting. You know, birds. Whatever it happened to be. But we were sort of brought up that that was kind of your duty, to be invested in the world around you and the people around you."

Brendan Carr Nominated as FCC CHAIR for 2025

Appointed to the FCC in 2017, Brendan Carr wrote the conservative FCC vision in <u>Project 2025</u> (p 845). He focused on four goals in the document, namely, "reining in Big Tech, promoting national security, unleashing economic prosperity, and ensuring FCC accountability and good governance." One argument

calls for elimination of "immunities that courts added to Section 230" of the Communications Decency Act, which means tech platforms are being protected from being held liable for user generated content, social media posts being an example.

Last April, Carr opposed the Commission's ruling to restore Net Neutrality.

In 2023, Carr supported Elon Musk's Starlink application for nearly \$900 million in subsidies. The FCC noted the application was ultimately denied for failure "to demonstrate that it could deliver the promised service."
