The idea for a soapbox, says KCIW News Director Lori Gallo Stoddard, was planted back at a pre-Covid Brookings' City Council meeting, when the former Mayor told vocal community members that, if they had complaints, they should "get on a soapbox."

Lisa: Dr Gazley, we saw people marching in the street in New York City the day after Donald Trump announced that the United States should own Gaza. Can you talk about the Stop Terror-Financing and Tax Penalties on American Hostages Act? What's going to happen to some of these protesters, potentially?

Beth Gazley: HR 9495 was something that has seen the light of day before. There have been multiple votes on it over the past couple of years. It passed the house in the fall and now it sits in the Senate. What it would do, if it passed the Senate, would allow the Treasury Secretary, who's a political appointee, to be able to designate organizations unilaterally, without going through the due process requirements the Internal Revenue Service has in place, and it could designate these as terrorist supporting organizations.




Two-Minute Tour from WXOX
