The Mad River Valley is a beautiful, small valley in the mountains of Central Vermont. It consists of resorts and the tiny towns of Waitsfield, North Waitsfield, Warren, Fayston and Moretown. The Vance family was planning to stay in a resort in Warren.

But the area is also home to a grassroots community group consisting of four people called Indivisible Mad River Valley.

Tisa Rennau is one of the four people who make up the grassroots community group. When she and the others heard that Vance was coming, they sprang into action. They had four days to plan a modest demo. What they got instead was thousands of protesters.
