


I know that part of our value is being able to be nimble and give customized support. Like, for the last couple of years, we did the Community Counts Initiative, and it was about helping stations build capacity to do really amazing programming that serves their community, develop a strategic plan. And it was kind of like, I don't want to say a boot camp, because that's so militaristic, but it was intensive, yeah, to get their core functions in a really healthy place, from organizational capacity to programming to engagement and all that. And now I feel that for stations in the membership the emergent need is like, 'We're in the oh shit moment of how do we talk about how important this is, so that people will continue to donate while they face all this uncertainty?'

But you also have people who, under such circumstances, have figured out ways to survive creatively, to pass the time productively, to make the best of what they're dealing with. You'll have stories about the incredible artworks that people have made from materials that would shock people on the outside. A whole range of human experience exists behind bars because a whole range of humans exist behind bars.
