The Corporation for Public
Broadcasting is going dark after
Congress clawed back half its funding
by passing President Trump's budget.
The CPB announced on August 1st it
would shutter at the end of the month.
The cut is set to inflict maximum
damage to publicly supported radio
stations around the country.
